Archaeology of a Dugout Canoe

Chris Olson and Ann Merriman of Maritime Heritage Minnesota will present the results of three c14 tests (radiocarbon dating) and a sample 3D scan of our dugout canoe. Radiocarbon testing and documentation has revealed the 12 oldest watercraft known in Minnesota, with the oldest held in our McLeod County History Museum. They explore what these results mean to our local history. The study was completed as part of a Minnesota Cultural Heritage Legacy Grant.
