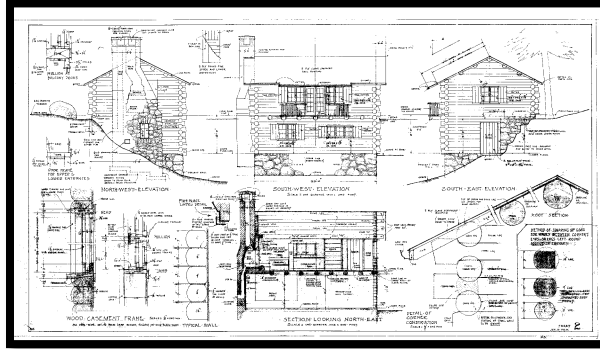




## Architectural Historian-Resource Assistant Position



### ***Superior National Forest-Greening Youth Foundation*** **Duluth, Minnesota** **May-October 2020**

The USDA-Forest Service and Greening Youth Foundation are seeking a highly motivated recent graduate for an architectural historian/historic architect paid internship position located on the Superior National Forest in beautiful Duluth, Minnesota. The position will provide support to engineering and heritage staff managing the historic built environment on three National Forests in the Upper Great Lakes region. The internship position is funded for 960 hours (about 6 months), and includes a weekly stipend and, if necessary, temporary housing or rental costs (negotiable), along with training/travel funding and potential health benefits. Successful completion of a minimum of 960 hours earns the intern a Direct Hire certificate for a permanent FS job. The successful candidate will gain experience in the following areas:

- Finalizing a draft National Register Nomination for ca. 1929 J. Jaeger cabin on Lake Vermilion.
- Assist FS staff with condition assessments and Future Use Determinations for CCC-era guard stations in the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness
- Assist with historic structure inventories, field assessments, and National Register evaluations for ca. 1925-1960 summer home cabin sites.
- Hands-on maintenance and rehabilitation of Depression-era round log structures.
- Assist with project review and drafting correspondence for SHPO consultation.
- GIS data entry and drafting historic property inventory forms/site forms.
- Assist with preparation of historic structure conditions assessments and maintenance plans.
